Barnardos Family Strengthening Project - Triple P (Positive Parenting Program)

It is common for children, like adults, to occasionally have disagreements and arguments. However when children fight there is always the risk that someone will be hurt. If not dealt with early, fighting and aggression can get worse. Some children fight to get what they want or when they don't know better ways to solve problems.

To reduce fighting set some simple house rules such as: sharing and taking turns, keep your hands and feet to yourself.

Catch your children playing cooperatively before fights and arguments begin. When problems are beginning, step in and help your child say what it is they want.

If fighting does occur, tell your child what to do. 'Amanda and Sarah stop pulling on the doll, take turns please' and be prepared to back up your instruction with a reasonable next step - such as removing the troublesome toy for a brief period.

After a while, return the toy so the children can practise playing cooperatively.
