Accidental rewards.

How often have you heard a parent say 'If I've told him once, I've told him a hundred times, don't do it'? Why do children do things that get them into trouble? Wouldn't you think if a behaviour gets a negative reaction, a child would learn not to do it again? Not necessarily.

Some behaviours, such as whining or showing off, are motivated simply because they get attention or an audience. The attention may be:

a frown, a glance, a scolding, a threat or even physical punishment.

When behaviour is motivated by seeking attention, it tends to occur when an audience is watching and rarely at other times. Children quickly learn that their behaviour is a good way to get other people to react.

Sometimes we can accidentally reward children by responding with our attention. Sometimes, we even reward them through toys and attention actually intended to distract them from doing something annoying, hoping to switch them on to another behaviour.

Who hasn't been tempted to buy something at the supermarket in exchange for silence and co-operation?

The challenge for parents is to avoid accidentally rewarding difficult behaviour and to start rewarding only the behaviour you want to encourage.
