#### Sunglasses

A new addition to our playground uniform began this week with the purchase by the school of a pair of good quality sunglasses in our school colour for each child to protect against the long-term harm from ultraviolet rays.

Recent Australian studies have demonstrated that sun-related eye conditions start at a young age. Children as young as 8 years of age show permanent sun-related scarring on their eyes.
