
Important information for parents who receive the SchoolDrive Subsidy

This semester families will only be paid for the number of days that their child physically attended school.

For the purpose of the subsidy, days that children worked from home will not be counted as they were not required to travel to school.

Are you claiming the School Drive Subsidy?

Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are eligible if:

- they are a resident of NSW, or an overseas student eligible for free government education
- aged 4 years 6 months, or older

From their home address:

- the distance to school exceeds 1.6 km (straight line distance) or is at least 2.3 km walking distance, and
- the distance to the nearest transport pick up point (where available) exceeds 1.6 km (straight line distance) or is at least 2.3 km walking distance.

The School Drive Subsidy provides eligible parents and guardians twice-yearly payments to help cover some of the expenses of getting children to school. Call 131 500


The Young Archies Art Competition
