### **Mudgee Show Art**

#### **Life Education Visit**

There was great excitement on Wednesday when the students arrived at school to see the Life Education Van parked at the front of the school. The chance to get in the van and meet with Harold the giraffe is always a wonderful opportunity. The Life Ed van helps to deliver highly engaging lessons to help students make safer and healthier life choices.

#### **Term One Learning**

English - students in all grades are investigating narrative as a feature this term. Students in the 4/5 class are completing a range of reading, writing and talking and listening activities based around the Tim Winton novel, Blueback. If you haven't had a chance to read it, I highly recommend it. The language, style and description are fantastic.

Students in the K-3 class are using a variety of quality texts to explore the concept of narrative. Texts so far have included Dark, Dark Tale by Ruth Brown and Hattie and the Fox by Mem Fox.

Maths—students are investigating big ideas around number, patterns, shapes and all four operations differentiated to be at their own level. We have a focus on multiplicative strategies which are those that involve grouping and skip counting. Lessons are a combination of hands -on activities, pencil and paper activities and online platforms such as Mathletics for consolidation of learnt skills.

Geography—term One focus is around important places. In the 4/5 class students are looking specifically at known places on the Australian Continent and in the K-3 class, how we care for important places. The excursion to Fern Tree Gully is directly linked to the Geography learning outcomes.

Science is about living things which fits nicely together with the Geography unit

Health learning for Term 1 is linked to the Life Education visit. Fitness focus is on developing fundamental movement skills and in the coming weeks there will be a focus on longer distance running in preparation for Cross Country.

## **Cross Country**

This year we will host our own Cross Country event at school on Thursday 28th March when we will be joined by the students from Hill End Public School for a Well Being Day. HEPS will visit Hargraves for the day as they did last year. As well as a cross country event, students will work together on a number of Easter related activities.

### **Weekly Awards**

Each week a student of the week will be selected. This student will have demonstrated enthusiasm for learning, produced some wonderful work or been kind and thoughtful in some way.
